WORK OF THE TWENTY-SECOND COUNCIL

Training programmes

In the year under review, the College Council had an uneventful year. We spent the year consolidating our GDFM programme, the College's Programme B MMed (FM) programme, and the College Fellowship Programme. The Convocation of the College this year will be held on Sunday, 28 November 2010 at the Tanglin Club.

Family Practice Skills Courses

The College continues to be actively running the Family Practice Skills Courses to meet the continuing professional development of College members. In the last two years, the College has been working closely with MCYS in the roll-out of its Mental Capacity Act activities which included a certification course for our family physicians as accredited certificate providers for the Mental Capacity Act, and also the implementation of the Code of Practice related to the Mental Capacity Act. In the family practice skills courses, the Health Promotion Board and a number of pharmaceutical companies have helped with sponsorships for the skills courses. I would like to take this opportunity to thank them.

The College Publications

The College Journal, the Singapore Family Physician enjoyed good publicity and thanks to the Editor Dr Tan Tze Lee, the Singapore Family Physician is now a member of the Western Pacific Region Index Medicus (WPRIM). This will raise the status of our publication.

Research Activities

The College has also in the past year been actively involved in research related activities. We were part of the organizing Committee in the Research Conference organised in Melaka, Malaysia. It was very successful. Malaysia has passed the baton to Singapore to organize the coming Conference from 4-5 December 2010. We are trying to make it a forum for family physicians to take part in learning and understanding research skills and participate in research activities in the Wonca Asia Pacific region and globally.

Practice management related activities

We were visited by the HINI and some time was spent in handling the hotline, dealing with briefing of our doctors, handling the movement of personal preventive equipment and the antivirals.

We have dealt with practice matters in the newspaper's Forum Page, reports on alleged unprofessional behaviour which were misconceptions received by the Police forwarded to us for our professional view, and matters related to aesthetic practice procedures.

The College Council has decided to set up a College Digest which is an electronic newspaper to keep our members informed on practice matters.

College Building Committee

The College Committee headed by Dr Tan See Leng has helped College acquire a property for development purposes. Let me take this opportunity to thank him and the Committee for the work done. Thanks are due to the Admin Manager Jennifer in these activities too.

The 22nd Council was formed following the Annual General Meeting and election of office bearers of the Council and its members on 27th June 2009.

Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine

The Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine (GDFM) is a vocational training certification for primary care doctors. The aim of this 2-year part-time trainee programme is to train primary care doctors to practise Family Medicine at an enhanced level to meet the needs of the child, the adolescent, the adult and the elderly. The course emphasises on basic clinical diagnostic and management skills essential to general practice.

The programme is planned to accommodate the busy doctor's schedule as almost all courses that require in-person attendance are conducted outside regular office hours. The course consists of the following:

- 8 modules of Family Medicine Modular Course (FMFC) with each comprising of 4 workshops (2 hours each), 1 tutorial (1 hour each), online case studies and multiple choice assessments
- 4 Practice Management Courses (9 hours in all) and 1 elective Family Practice Skills Course (6 hours)

The examination is conducted by DGMS, NUS and consists of :

- Written paper – Applied Knowledge Test /MCQ (2 hours); Key Features Problems Paper (1 hour)
- Skills Assessment in the Objective Structured Clinical Examination (OSCE), (2 hours)

The GDFM (Singapore) is recognised by the Singapore Medical Council as a registrable medical qualification.

Master of Medicine (Family Medicine)

There are currently two programmes to prepare doctors for the MMed (FM) examinations.

Programme A is a 3-year hospital and polyclinic based training programme generally for the younger doctors who have been awarded the Family Medicine traineeship. Within the 3 years the trainee must also complete the Family Medicine Modular Course conducted by the College.

Programme B is a structured training programme designed for mature practising family physicians in Singapore.

It is jointly organised by the College of Family Physicians Singapore and the Division of Graduate Medical Studies, National University of Singapore.

This 1-year part-time course provides a comprehensive and structured training programme for doctors working in primary care who have completed the 8 modules of the Family Medicine Modular Course (FMMC) to prepare them to sit for the MMed (FM) examinations.

The MMed (FM) examination is conducted by the DGMS, NUS and consists of:

- Written paper – MEQ, Essay, SAQ, Talk
- MCQ
- Slide interpretation
- Oral examination
- Clinical examination

Albert and Mary Lim Award

CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT / MEDICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMMES AND COURSES

The College promotes CPD and CME through the Family Medicine Modular Course, Family Practice Skills Course, MMed (Family Medicine) Programme B, Family Medicine Membership and Fellowship Programme.

The Institute of Family Medicine, an organ within the College, plays a significant role in developing the contents and syllabi of these programmes and courses.

During the year the IFM reviewed, updated and edited the notes as well as their E-Learning components for Module 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 of the Family Medicine Modular Course to make them more relevant and user friendly to the course participants.

The Family Medicine Modular Course consists of 8 modules of knowledge acquisition and is a requirement for doctors who are preparing for the Graduate Diploma in Family Medicine (GDFM) Programme and the Master of Medicine (Family Medicine) Programme A. Each year four modules are covered.

The notes for the modules are on the College's E-Learning website and can be downloaded by the Family Medicine trainees. By having them online, the trainees can refer to these notes twenty-four hours a day.

For the year April 2009-Mar 2010 there were 99 trainees registered in the GDFM course, 8 trainees in the MMed (FM) Programme B and 17 trainees in the Family Medicine Fellowship Programme.

Family Practice Skills Course (FPSC)

During this financial year, the College conducted five Family Practice Skills Courses.

The components of a skills course may include one or more of the following:

1. Distance Learning with verification (6 CME points)
2. Lectures (max of 2 CME points – 1 point for each seminar of 3 lectures)
3. Workshop (2 CME points)
4. Small group activities including clinical attachments, tutorials, ward-rounds
5. Assessments which can be written, oral, demonstration and/or clinical (for some courses)

A typical FPSC template is a course with six units of distance learning with verification of 30 MCQs, two seminars, and one workshop conducted over two afternoon sessions e.g., one Saturday afternoon and Sunday afternoon or two Saturday afternoons.

E-Learning

The E-Learning programme launched in 2003 has been incorporated into the GDFM training programme. An E-Learning component for each module was introduced, consisting of therapeutic notes, case scenarios, assessment by MCQs and a case review to be put up by a tutorial group.

Accreditation of core CME points

The College is represented by A/Prof Lee Kheng Hock and Dr Jonathan Pang in the SMC Maintenance of Competency Committee and A/Prof Lee Kheng Hock and Dr Matthew Ng in the SMC CME Co-ordinating Committee. Dr Tan Tze Lee and Dr Leong Choon Kit have taken over as the college representatives in the last committee. The College works closely with the Singapore Medical Council to ensure that the quality of the CME events is acceptable. It continues to advise the SMC on the accreditation of core family medicine CME events through its panel of FM CME advisors appointed by the College.

SIGNIFICANT COLLEGE EVENTS

Commencement of Academic Year 2009

As usual this was inaugurated with a Commencement Ceremony which was held on 27 June 2009 at Health Promotion Board.

There were 99 trainees in the GDFM course, 20 trainees in the MMed (FM) Programme A, 8 trainees in the MMed (FM) Programme B and 17 trainees in the Family Medicine Fellowship Programme registered.

Convocation 2009

The Family Medicine Convocation Ceremony was held on 28th November 2009 and the Guest of Honour was Dr Lee Suan Yew.

7 doctors were conferred the FCFP(S), 16 doctors were conferred the MCFP(S).

76 GDFM graduates and 14 MMed (FM) graduates were recognized.

Annual General Meeting 2009

The College AGM held on 27th June 2009 was notable because we finally got a quorum after failed attempts in the past few years. To cap it all the quorum of two hundred voting members was a record in the history of the College.

The resolution to amend the quorum to fifty voting members or 1/8 of the total voting members, whichever is less and the resolution to introduce a new category of life membership were unanimously approved.

College Building Committee

This was formed in July 2008 to advise the Council on acquiring a property or properties for investment or for use by the College.

Extraordinary General Meeting

Family Practice Skills Course (FPSC)

The Family Practice Skills Courses serve the continuing professional development needs of the General Practitioner / Family Physician. We are able to run at least one course a quarter. See Table 2.

The components of a skill course may include one or more of the following:

1. Distance Learning with verification (6 CME points)
2. Lectures (max of 2 CME points – 1 point for each seminar of 3 lectures)
3. Workshop (2 CME points)
4. Small group activities including clinical attachments, tutorials, ward-rounds
5. Assessments which can be written, oral, demonstration and/or clinical (for some courses)

A typical FPSC template is a course with six units of distance learning with verification of 30 MCQs, two seminars, and one workshop conducted over two afternoon sessions e.g., one Saturday afternoon and Sunday afternoon or two Saturday afternoons.

During the year the College conducted 5 Family Practice Skills Courses.

The Singapore Family Physician has undergone several significant changes over the last 12 months. In November 2009, we applied for and were accepted for indexing by the Western Pacific Region Index Medicus (WPRIM). We also adopted the Editorial Manager system as the online manuscript management system, which will take care of all article submissions. Peer reviews are now blinded, and all editorial office functions which were previously manually performed by our secretariat staff are also now automated. Special accolade should be given to Linda and Ariel of the college secretariat whose hard work made it possible for us to configure and implement Editorial Manager in a little over ten weeks before it was launched in February 2010.

Automating these functions has greatly enhanced the workflow and efficiency of our journal editing process. Together with the launch of the Western Pacific Region Index Medicus database in May 2010, where the SFP will be indexed as a peer reviewed medical journal, my hope that more of our family physicians and general practitioners will take up the gauntlet of primary care research, advancing the cause of primary care in Singapore comes closer to becoming a reality.

FAMILY MEDICINE DEVELOPMENTS IN THE INTERNATIONAL SCENE

The 19th Wonca World Conference was held from 19 – 23 May 2010 in Cancun, Mexico. In the triennium 2010 to 2012, Dr Richard Roberts is the World President. The President Elect is Professor Michael Kidd. The next World Conference will be held in Prague, Czech Republic in June 2013. The dates will be announced at a later date.







These notes form an integral part of the financial statements.

The financial statements were authorised for issue by the Management on 18 May 2010.

1) DOMICILE AND ACTIVITIES

The College of Family Physicians Singapore (the “College”) is registered in the Republic of Singapore under the Societies Act Cap 151 and has its registered office and principal place of business at:

01-02 College of Medicine Building
Singapore 169854

The principal activities of the College are:

- i) Advance the art and science of medicine
- ii) Discuss medical and scientific problems
- iii) Assist in providing post graduate study courses
- iv) Arrange for and/or provide instructions for undergraduate or post graduate students
- v) Promote and maintain high standards of family practice of medicine.

2) Basis of preparation

(a) Statement of compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Singapore Financial Reporting Standards (FRS).

(b) Basis of measurement

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except as disclosed in the significant accounting policies in Note 3.

(c) Functional and presentation currency

These financial statements are presented in Singapore dollars which is the College’s functional currency. All financial information presented in Singapore dollars has been rounded to the nearest dollar, unless otherwise stated.

(d) Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with FRSs requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS – 31 MARCH 2010

2) Basis of preparation (continued)

(d) Use of estimates and judgements (continued)

The financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2010 do not include assumptions and estimation uncertainties that have a significant risk of resulting in a matter adjustment within the next financial year.

e) Change in accounting policies

The accounting policies adopted are consistent with those of the previous financial year except for the adoption of FRS 1 *Presentation of Financial Statements* (Revised) which is mandatory for the annual financial period beginning on or after 1 January 2009.

The Standard introduces the statement of comprehensive income which presents income and expense recognised in the period. This statement may be presented in one single statement, or two linked statements. The College has elected to present this statement in a single statement.

Comparative information has been re-presented so that it also is in conformity with the revised standard.

3) Significant accounting policies

The accounting policies set out below have been applied consistently to all periods presented in these financial statements, and have been applied consistently by College.

(b) Financial instruments

Non-derivative financial assets

The College initially recognises receivables and deposits on the date that they are originated. All other financial assets are recognised initially on the trade date at which the College becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

The College derecognises a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the asset expire, or it transfers the rights to receive the contractual cash flows on the financial asset in a transaction in which substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset are transferred. Any interest in transferred financial assets that is created or retained by the College is recognised as a separate asset or liability.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS – 31 MARCH 2010

3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

(b) Financial instruments (continued)

Non-derivative financial assets (continued)

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount presented in the balance sheet when, and only when, the College has a legal right to offset the amounts and intends either to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

The College has the following non-derivative financial assets: loans and receivables including cash and cash equivalents.

Loans and receivables

Loans and receivables are financial assets with fixed or determinable payments that are not quoted in an active market. Such assets are recognised initially at fair value plus any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, loans and receivables are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment losses.

Loans and receivables comprise receivables and amount due from College of Family Physicians Singapore Holdings Pte Ltd.

Cash and cash equivalents comprise cash balances and bank deposits. Bank overdrafts that are repayable on demand and form an integral part of the College's cash management are included as a component of cash and cash equivalents for the purpose of the cash flow statement.

Non-derivative financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are recognised initially on the trade date at which the College becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

The College derecognises a financial liability when its contractual obligations are discharged or cancelled or expire.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount presented in the balance sheet when, and only when, the College has a legal right to offset the amounts and intends either to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously

The College has the following non-derivative financial liabilities: payables.

Such financial liabilities are recognised initially at fair value plus any directly attributable transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, these financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS – 31 MARCH 2010

3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

(c) Plant and equipment

Recognition and measurement

Items of plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses.

Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the asset. The cost of self-constructed assets includes the cost of materials and direct labour, any other costs directly attributable to bringing the assets to a working condition for their intended use, the costs of dismantling and removing the items and restoring the site on which they are located, and capitalised borrowing costs. Cost also may include transfers from other comprehensive income of any gain or loss on qualifying cash flow hedges of foreign currency purchases of plant and equipment. Purchased software that is integral to the functionality of the related equipment is capitalised as part of that equipment.

When parts of an item of plant and equipment have different useful lives, they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of plant and equipment.

Gains and losses on disposal of an item of plant and equipment are determined by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount of plant and equipment, and are recognised net within other income in profit or loss. When revalued assets are sold, the amounts included in the revaluation reserve are transferred to retained earnings.

Subsequent costs

The cost of replacing a part of an item of plant and equipment is recognised in the carrying amount of the item if it is probable that the future economic benefits embodied within the part will flow to the College and its cost can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of the replaced part is derecognised. The costs of the day-to-day servicing of plant and equipment are recognised in profit or loss as incurred.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated over the depreciable amount, which is the cost of an asset, or other amount substituted for cost, less its residual value.

Depreciation is recognised in profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the estimated useful lives of each part of an item of plant and equipment, since this most closely reflects the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the asset.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS – 31 MARCH 2010

3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

(c) Plant and equipment (continued)

The estimated useful lives for the current and comparative periods are as follows:

Depreciation methods, useful lives and residual values are reviewed at each financial year-end and adjusted if appropriate.

(d) Impairment

Financial assets (including receivables)

A financial asset is assessed at each reporting date to determine whether there is objective evidence that it is impaired. A financial asset is impaired if objective evidence indicates that a loss event has occurred after the initial recognition of the asset, and that the loss event had a negative effect on the estimated future cash flows of that asset that can be estimated reliably.

Objective evidence that financial assets are impaired can include default or delinquency by a debtor, restructuring of an amount due to the College on terms that the College would not consider otherwise or an indications that a debtor will enter bankruptcy.

The College considers evidence of impairment for receivables both a specific asset and collective level. All individually significant receivables are assessed for specific impairment. All individually significant receivables found not to be specifically impaired are then collectively assessed for any impairment that has been incurred but not yet identified. Receivables that are not individually significant are collectively assessed for impairment by grouping together receivables with similar risk characteristics.

In assessing collective impairment, the College uses historical trends of the probability of default, timing of recoveries and the amount of loss incurred, adjusted for management's judgement as to whether current economic and credit conditions are such that the actual losses are likely to be greater or less than suggested by historical trends.

3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

(d) Impairment (continued)

Financial assets (including receivables) (continued)

An impairment loss in respect of a financial asset measured at amortised cost is calculated as the difference between its carrying amount and the present value of the estimated future cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. Losses are recognised in profit or loss and reflected in an allowance account against receivables. When a subsequent event causes the amount of impairment loss to decrease, the decrease in impairment loss is reversed through profit or loss.

(e) Employee benefits

Defined contribution plans

A defined contribution plan is a post-employment benefit plan under which an entity pays fixed contributions to Central Provident Fund (CPF) and will have no legal or constructive obligation to pay further amounts. Obligations for contributions to defined contribution pension plans are recognised as an employee benefit expense in profit or loss in the periods during which services are rendered by employees.

(f) Revenue

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the College and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Members' annual subscription are recognised when due.

Course fees (from continuing professional education and training) are recognised when the services are rendered.

Advertising income is recognised when advertisement is placed.

Interest income is recognised as the interest accrues based on effective interest rate method unless collectibility is in doubt.

Management fee charged by the College is recognised when due.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS – 31 MARCH 2010

3) Significant accounting policies (continued)

(g) Grants and sponsorship

Grants are recognised at their fair value where there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attaching condition will be complied with. When the grant relates to an expense item, it is recognised in the Statement of Comprehensive Income over the periods necessary to match them on a systematic basis, to the costs, which it is intended to compensate. Where the grant relates to an asset, the fair value is credited to a deferred income account and is released to the Statement of Comprehensive Income over the expected useful life of the relevant asset by equal annual installments.

(h) Finance income

Finance income comprises interest income on funds invested. Interest income is recognised as it accrues in profit or loss, using the effective interest method.

(i) Income tax expenses

The Society has been registered as a Society under the Societies Act. With effect from the Year of Assessment 2008, the requirement for Society to spend at least 80% of their annual receipts on charitable objects in Singapore within 2 years in order to enjoy income tax exemption has been removed. As a registered and exempt charity it will enjoy automatic income tax exemption.

(j) New standards and interpretations not yet adopted

New standards, amendments to standards and interpretations that are not yet effective for the year ended 31 March 2010 have not been applied in preparing these financial statements. None of these will have an effect on the financial statements of the College.

b) Financial risk management objectives and policies

The Management reviews and agrees policies for managing the financial risk of the College. Each of these risks are summarised below:

Credit risk

Credit risk is the risk that counterparties may be unable to meet the terms of their agreements. Except for amount due from College of Family Physicians Singapore Holdings Pte Ltd, the College has no major concentration of credit risk.

The College places its cash and fixed deposits with creditworthy institutions.

The carrying amount of financial assets recorded in the financial statements, represents the College's maximum exposure to credit risk.

Liquidity risk

In the management of liquidity risk, the College monitors and maintains a level of cash and bank balances deemed adequate by the Management to finance the College's operations and mitigate the effects of fluctuations in cash flows.

Interest rate risk

The College's exposure to market risk for changes in interest rates relates primarily to the College's fixed deposits and bank balances. The College's policy is to place surplus funds in fixed deposits at favourable interest rates with financial institutions in Singapore. The College's exposure to changes in interest rate is minimal.

Foreign exchange risk

The College's operational activities are carried out in Singapore dollar, which is the functional currency. The exposure to risk arising from movements in currency exchange rates relates only to cash at bank denominated in US dollar which is immaterial.

Fair values of financial assets and financial liabilities

The carrying amount of financial assets and financial liabilities recorded in the financial statements represents their respective fair values due to short-term nature of these accounts.
